And finally, this week each class got to visit the church for 'Experience Easter'. The children had some challenging tasks to think deeply about the significance of each event, but they were impeccably behaved as ever and answered very thoughtfully. Class 1 News

All children have had a busy half term learning through play in Class 1. Nursery children have been enjoying participating in 'Foundation for phonics' sessions each day, especially sessions with Bertha the Bus!

With the weather being so wet we have made sure we've put on our puddle suits and have made full use of the mud kitchen and all those lovely puddles. This half term we have been

doing lots of work on the Easter story including; retelling the story using props, modelling parts of the story, drawing pictures and writing. We have been working hard on our maths learning about place value with numbers to 50.

Class 2 News

The biggest piece of news from Class 2 this term is their AMAZING efforts in achieving the RSPB Bronze Wild Challenge accreditation for the school. In their gardening and science lessons, they have undertaken a number of tasks including researching birds and how to look after them; spotting different habitats; planting trees for nature; undertaking plant surveys and recording a 'nature walk'. They had to submit evidence for 6 activities to the RSPB, who wrote back to say how fantastic their entries were and awarded us the accreditation, along with a personal certificate for each child. Do take some time to look at their display which showcases their research on birds in particular next time you are in school!





Class 3 News

In class 3 we have been reading 'When the Mountains Roared'. We have enjoyed the book so far, and have written a setting description of India, and two emotional diary entries through the eyes of our main character. We look forward to reading the rest of it.

In maths we have converted different measurements of length, capacity, mass, and time; calculated perimeter and area; and described position using coordinates. In science we have finished studying the body, including looking at the effect of diet and lifestyle on our health and fitness.

We have concluded our topic on the countries of Europe, and using their knowledge of climate, physical and human features the children researched and compared some European countries. In art, the children have used collage to make some distorted faces and paper figures. Inspired by Andy Warhol, the children worked in small groups to produce some fabulous 'Pop Art' on display in the corridor!


