It recognises the commitments we've made to support well-being in the school and we're praised particularly for our use of the teaching kitchen, forest schools and nurture groups to support our pupil's development. Thank you to the families who were able to attend the celebration assembly where we were presented the award by Kay Breton from Suffolk County Council.

It was lovely to celebrate the King's coronation together earlier in the month. Everyone looked fantastic in their regal red, white and blue outfits. We held a special collective worship to learn about the new monarch and what was planned for the coronation, then each class spent the week creating their own pieces of work to mark the celebration. Class 1 read "The King's Underpants" and created their own pants for the King (!), Class 2 made crowns with words and phrases linked to the coronation, whilst Class 3 created their own bunting. All of the work is displayed in the front entrance - please do come in to see it before it gets taken down at the end of term.

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Class 1 News

Class 1 has thoroughly enjoyed learning all about our school and local area. We have been looking at maps and identifying places of interest and their uses and purposes for the wider community.

We used a map (and the local expertise of Miss Phillips!) to plan a route around our village. It was a particularly cold and windy (Summer) day but nevertheless we put on our coats, grabbed our maps and set off on our tour of the village. First stop was the Rec, next we walked along the path and could see Orford castle, we turned left then right and walked past the pump then through the alleyway to the shop. At the shop our Year 1 children developed their money skills by selecting and paying for a postcard to send to our friend Aurelia in London. They had to decide which coins to pay with and then had to wait for their change. After the shop we visited the bakery, the church and finished our tour at the fire station. All of these places we managed to tick off our list as we recognised them.

It was a busy walk for little legs but everyone managed really well. Next we will be turning our knowledge of the local area into symbols for our own maps of Orford.





Class 2 News

We have had an extremely busy term but the children have risen to the challenge and have worked extremely hard, we are very proud of Class 2. As part of our settlement topic, we enjoyed a walk around Orford, looking at land use, particularly around the Castle, to begin introducing this new topic. We have begun to construct our own Castles out of papier mache, noting different types of Castles such as motte and bailey, concentric castles and



castles with keeps. We have also begun to write labels describing parts of a Castle and have been attempting to add details using connectives, adjectives and enhanced sentence construction. We will look forward to completing these and sharing them with you.



We have had a big vocabulary drive this half term, making more conscious choices and considering the meaning of our writing. We LOVED making crowns for the King's coronation using regal vocabulary - they are all hanging up as part of the front entrance display. In Literacy we also "read" the wordless book 'Journey' by Aaron Becker and chose an aspect of the story to bring to life in words. Our writing was thoughtful and exciting and many of the

descriptions helped the rest of the teachers imagine exactly what happened in the story!!

Class 3 News















In class 3 we finished our class text 'When the Mountains Roared'. We really enjoyed the book, and concluded by creating a leaflet to promote the lead character's hotel in the Himalayan Mountains. The children have worked fabulously hard writing them and they look amazing! In maths we have revised work on the topics of area, perimeter, measurements, all 4 operations in a problem solving context, studied timetables and time, and worked on maths puzzles and investigations. In science, we have learned lots about adaptations and evolution, and the children have studied Charles Darwin's contribution towards the theory of 'Survival of the Fittest'. As an experiment, we used different tool to pick up different types of foods, to demonstrate how birds beaks have adapted to their diets, like the Galapagos finches. We learnt about Mary Anning's contribution to fossil hunting and studied the evidence fossils show of evolution on our planet.

We are continuing our study on Ancient Greece, and the children have studied where and when this civilisation lived and some of their more famous historical figures, including Aristotle and Alexander the Great. The children researched what it was like to live in the city states of Athens and Sparta, and then selected in which they would like to have lived! In art, the children have made observational drawings of Ancient Greek pots, and drew and painted their own designs, featuring figures competing in the historical Olympic Games. We are now in the process of their construction from clay and the final decoration of our pottery! Year 5 and 6 have also been fortunate to have some Financial Education sessions delivered by a volunteer from CAP (Christians Against Poverty) – they have enjoyed taking part in these sessions, exploring wants and needs, ways of earning an income and practiced the skill of budgeting.
