Right back at the beginning of June, we welcomed the Year 6s from Bawdsey Primary school for a joint transition day run by the Just42 charity, who organise our Thursday Kid's Clubs. Transition day. Class 1 News

The children have had a fantastic final term of learning in Class 1. We have enjoyed reading and exploring fantasy stories and making our own creative choices as authors to take our characters on their own adventures.

The up and down weather has provided us with lots of learning opportunities our outdoor area. We have loved splashing in natural muddy puddles when the rain has been heavy and have learnt how to create exactly the right consistency when the weather has been dry (sorry about the clothes!) Our mud pit has provided lots of hands-on mathematical development as we

have explored counting, measurements and capacity.



In preparation for our trip to The Red House in Aldeburgh the children in Class 1 have been exploring their interest in butterflies, where we have learnt about their lifecycle and used identification charts to spot each type as they fly through our garden (and sometimes into our classroom!) Wow what a fantastic end to the year Class 1! Well done!

Class 2 News



Class 2 have had a brilliantly busy half term! We started with our exciting trip to Orford Castle, where we learnt all about how the buildings have changed over time; ways in which the castle would be defended; and what all the rooms were used for.... We particularly liked the toilet! Everyone was super brave and managed to get all the way to the top.




Back at school, we used our writing skills to create diary entries of our trip, build our own castles AND print designs on our own flags for the top.In maths, we have been working on shape and space, learning the names and properties of common 2D and 3D shapes. Whilst in science we have been grafting away in the gardens to clear the vegetable beds and plant seeds ready for the new school year, and also created some excellent wheels showing life cycles of animals which go through metamorphosis.



All between the many other events happening in school - we have absolutely earned our summer break!









They did a terrific job and really entertained their audiences, and as their class teacher, I am very proud of them. In other areas of the curriculum, class 3 have continued to work hard. In maths, we have studied the properties of 2d and 3d shapes, identifying and measuring angles, reading and drawing line graphs, bar charts and tables, as well as problem solving. Class 3 have



learned about what affects electrical circuits and how to draw circuits using the recognised symbols in their science lessons. We wrote an alternative chapter from our book 'Who Let the Gods Out' and a gruesome retelling of the myth, 'Theseus and the Minotaur'! We have researched historical Ancient Greek philosophers and inventors, and looked at typical Ancient Greek Olympics. The children in class 3

also decorated their Ancient Greek style pottery by painting on silhouettes of Olympic figures.
